



	Write e-mails to your friends who are also learning English		
	Write descriptions of places that you visit		
	Go to the social programme writing workshop which is held once a month		
	Copy an article out word for word and look at the construction of the sentences, spelling and punctuation.		

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Speaking		
	Make friends with people that don't speak your language	
	Join Talk24 events	
	Record yourself speaking	
	Speak to people in pubs, restaurants, while waiting in a queue etc.	
	Be strict with yourself - speak more slowly and accurately	
	Go to	
	Decide a time each day with your friends when you'll only speak English
